Nursery

This half term, the nursery children will be looking at the following books: Scarecrow's Secret, Postman Bear and Father Christmas Needs A Wee. The children will be completing a variety of activities related to these.

In phonics, we will be looking at instrumental sounds and body percussion.

In Maths, we will be looking at counting and subtilizing, as well as gaining an understanding of counting small groups of objects.

Reception

This half term, we are going to be focussing on The Gruffalo, The Gingerbread Man and Treasury of Songs by Julia Donaldson.

In phonics, we will be continuing with our RWI scheme. The children will be assessed every 4-6 weeks and learn new sounds accordingly.

In Maths, we will be continuing to deepen our understanding of numbers 1-5, number bonds, properties of simple 2D shapes and patterns.
