
In maths, the children will be looking at multiplication and division and will apply their knowledge to problems in context. We will then move onto fractions, looking in particular at finding fractions of quantities and finding equivalents. Towards the end of the half term, we will start to convert improper fractions to mixed numbers. In order to do this successfully, it is really important that the children keep practising their times tables. Please encourage your child to learn the times tables up to 12 x 12, if they do not already know them, as this will really help them with their maths work. TTRockstars is an excellent tool to assist with the learning of times tables so please encourage your child to take full advantage of this programme.

This half term, our geography topic will focus on 'Deserts and Rainforests.' During this unit we will look at deserts and rainforests around the world. The children will explore each of their features and locate them on a map.

As scientists, the children will be exploring, 'Living things and their habitats'. They will develop their knowledge of life cycles by creating various life cycles for different animals.
