## <u>FS1</u>



This half term, inspired by Science Week, we are diving into the world of pollution in the sea, supported by the story, 'The Odd Fish'. Cue, a new generation of

environmentalists! Following on from fish, we will turn our attention to all things growing, as we learn to retell the story of 'The Enormous Turnip'.

In phonics, we will focus on rhyming words through stories and songs, count syllables in compound words then identify the deleted syllable. We will also begin to identify initial sounds in words.

In maths, we will continue to recite numbers to 10 and beyond, investigate 2D shapes, measure areas and objects with non-standard units and use mathematical language to describe our findings.

This half term we are going to be focussing on; Handa's Surpise, Jack and The Beanstalk and many other exciting stories. Alongside this, we will be enjoying some delicious fruit tasting and looking at how plants grow.

In phonics, we will be continuing to follow RWI. The children will be reassessed this half term and grouped accordingly. The children are continuing to be very excited about their phonics sessions.

In maths, we will be introducing numbers 11-15. We will be looking at where these can be found, different representations and how the numbers can be created. We will also be deepening our understanding of shape and pattern.
