Writing & Reading

We will be focusing on writing a balanced argument, as the children will take part in a real life debate regarding the positives and negatives of children having access to mobile phones. Foundation Subjects

They will also locate the river Nile and know how significant it was to the Ancient Egyptians. Homework and Home Reading

Maths

Our focus for Maths this term is volume, where the children will have the opportunity to use manipulatives to support their learning. We will also look at understanding and interpreting statistics. The children will be expected to read data from charts and line graphs and answer questions regarding the information.

<u>Science</u>

In Science, the children will focus on designing a habitat for a hermit crab in relation to Science Week. Our topic is electricity and the children will recap how to construct a simple circuit and plan an investigation to discover if wire length effects how components in a circuit work.
