<b>Year 1</b>	<b>Human and Physical Geography</b> What are the key weather changes between seasons in the United Kingdom? What are the key differences and similarities between different types of settlements (town/village/city)?	<b>Locational Knowledge</b> What are the four countries that make up the United Kingdom? What are the seven continents of the world and can you locate them on a map?	<b>Place Knowledge</b> Where are the hot and cold places on Earth and how are they different from each other?
<b>Year 2</b>	<b>Locational Knowledge</b> What are the names of the five major oceans of the world, and can you find them on a map? What are the four capital cities of the United Kingdom?	<b>Human and Physical Geography</b> What is the difference between physical and human features of an area? Can you identify and name physical and human features of our locality?	<b>Place Knowledge</b> How are Hull and Cape Town similar and different in their physical geography? How are Hull and Cape Town similar and different in their human geography?
<b>Year 3</b>	<b>Human and Physical Geography</b> What are earthquakes and volcanoes and how can they impact the world? Where are volcanoes commonly found and what is the reason for this?	<b>Locational Knowledge</b> Can you locate major cities and counties (including the ones in which we live) on a map of the United Kingdom? Can you locate some of the countries that make up Europe on a range of maps?	<b>Place Knowledge</b> How is the climate of Hull and Rome different? Why may this be? Why is Rome seen as the perfect place to visit as a tourist?
<b>Year 4</b>	<b>Human and Physical Geography</b> What are the stages of the water cycle? What are the key features of a river and its journey and why are major towns and cities often built next to a river?	<b>Locational Knowledge</b> Where are the "tropics" and what is special about this area of the Earth? Can you name and locate major mountain ranges on a map of the world?	<b>Place Knowledge</b> How are Rome and Athens similar and how are they different? What can thematic maps (climate/population) tell us about a location?
<b>Year 5</b>	<b>Human and Physical Geography</b> What are the major differences between the physical features of contrasting biomes (desert and rainforest)?	<b>Locational Knowledge</b> What are coordinates when used on a map and why are they used? Can you identify simple symbols from Ordnance Survey maps?	<b>Place Knowledge</b> How does the climate in Manaus differ from the climate of Hull, Rome and Athens? Why does Manaus attract tourists? Is it as popular as Rome and Athens? Why?
<b>Year 6</b>	<b>Human and Physical Geography</b> Are resources distributed equally across the world? What impact does this have on farmers and traders in different areas?	<b>Locational Knowledge</b> Why are there different time zones across the world and what impact does this have? Can you use 6-point grid references to identify and find features of London on a map?	<b>Place Knowledge</b> Which features make a location desirable in which to live? How does Los Angeles compare as a location to others previously studied?
