## BRITISH VALUES

At Broadacre, through lessons, assemblies, and other activities, we promote the fundamental British Values.

The values are:

**Rule of Law**- everyone in society is treated equally and fairly, and that everyone follows the same rules and laws. This value promotes a sense of order and stability in society, and helps to prevent crime and other harmful behaviours.

**Individual Liberty**- Individual liberty allows people to pursue their own goals and interests, providing they do not harm others. This British value is based on the idea that people should be free to make their own decisions and choices within the bounds of the law.

**Democracy**- Democracy is the foundation of the UK's political system. This British value is based on the idea that everyone should have an equal say in how their country is run, and that the government should be accountable to the people. All things voting, elections and referendums come in to play here.

**Mutual Respect and Tolerance of Those With Different Faiths or Beliefs**- (1) Mutual respect and (2) tolerance of different faiths and beliefs. Whether you view these as one whole, or as two individual values, they both promote understanding and acceptance of people from different backgrounds and with different beliefs, and help to create a more inclusive and diverse society.

Weekly assemblies focus on a specific British value and weekly awards will be given for pupils showing that week's value.

## DARE

**Determination, Aspiration, Resilience and Excellence** are characteristics recognised by the school as being the ingredients for a successful life.

In all that we do, we promote these characteristics, recognising and rewarding pupils who have shown them.

Through the school reward system, your child may come home with stickers, certificates, or even a book from the book machine. This reward will be for showing one or more of our key characteristics.

## BIKES AND SCOOTERS

We would like to politely remind all pupils and parents that bikes and scooters are not to be used on the playground or the MUGA. This is to ensure that everybody is able to use the school site safely. There were two recent incidents that caused concern. The first where a small child was knocked over by a pupil on a bike and a second where a bike was crashed into the bike shed, causing £200 of damage.

Please support us with this by ensuring that your child dismounts from their bike and scooter before entering the school grounds.

The school are investing in additional bike sheds and scooter racks.

## ATTENDANCE

School attendance remains a huge focus. As we near the end of the term, pupils with 100% attendance will be rewarded, as will pupils who have demonstrated significantly improved attendance.

Attending school regularly has a significant impact on attainment and future progress.
