Children wishing to use the forest school area can bring in their own wellies. We do have pairs in school, but these are limited.

The Year 4 pupils have been working hard on developing their enterprise skills. They were loaned £150 from a local business and were tasked to make that into a profit. Through organizing events and making and selling treats, the pupils made a huge £320 profit.

This is a wonderful and impressive achievement and will hopefully build the children's confidence in working with money- a key life skill,

We wanted to update and remind parents on booking trips. To give consent for trips, we will no longer send paper slips home. We are requiring parents to tick the box on ParentPay giving consent. This ensures that all information is in one place.
